Iowa State defeated Oklahoma (top 5) and TCU (top 10).

Northwestern defeated Michigan State (top 25) and Iowa (top 35).

San Diego State defeated Stanford (top 25) and Arizona State.

Oklahoma has a tougher strength of schedule, defeated one top 5 and two top 15 teams.

Alabama and Miami have weak strength of schedules. Alabama have only beaten LSU and Mississippi State, neither ranked in the top 15. Miami only beat Notre Dame (top 5) and Virginia Tech (top 35).
